Please consider the following before condemning us

The City of Dearborn has been under attack for several years by a group identifying themselves as Acts 17 Apologetics. They arrive in Dearborn with the intent to disrupt a local cultural festival and misrepresent facts in order to further their mission of raising funds through emotional response. The funds they raise are then used to finance travel and cameras to disrupt other events in other cities.

In our case, the targeted event is not about the Muslim faith or its believers. It is a Middle Eastern cultural festival sponsored by a Chamber of Commerce and a local charitable service organization. Neither of these two entities have a religious alignment.

Like events in cities all over our nation, this festival has a variety of entertainment and interests, including rides, games, performances, foods, souvenirs, and community information. Also like other events, it relies on sponsorships and fees to cover its costs. Large tents are set up to house organizations and businesses that want to have access to the thousands of people attending this event. These groups pay a modest fee for the privilege and are allowed to carry out their activity in an assigned space within the tents. There is no restriction placed on any lawful activity carried out in this manner, including preaching the word of God.

This past year, five Christian organizations and two Muslim organizations chose this lawful method of reaching the attendees. This is similar to past years and there has never been a problem or controversy about this type of preaching or religious engagement. The total number of table vendors at the festival exceeds eighty, so these seven faith-based groups represent a relatively small aspect of the festival. In all the materials released by Acts 17 Apologetics they have failed to mention this manner of preaching and evidencing the teaching of Jesus Christ, even though they have been offered the same opportunity each year.

In addition to the booths, we have a free speech zone at the festival for those that want free access to the festival to promote their message. This space was utilized this past year by two different Christian groups who were allowed to preach and proselytize the entire weekend without any interference. Acts 17 Apologetics did not mention this either, even though they were within 30 feet of this space when they pretended to be arrested.

Yes, I said pretended to be arrested. In a video they have posted on their website, they are standing near the Ferris wheel when some police officers approached them on Saturday, June 19. They lead you to believe that they were arrested shortly thereafter for passing out Christian flyers. Although they were temporarily detained for violating the festival rules regarding the location of the distribution of literature, they were not arrested on that day. And they were never arrested for passing out flyers.

On Friday, June 18, they behaved very differently than what you saw on film from Saturday, June 19. They were not handing out flyers but were aggressively engaging passers-by in confrontational debate when they were arrested and cited for Breach of the Peace and Failure to Obey the Lawful Order of a Police Officer. See www.cityofdearborn.org for more details.

Acts 17 always retained the right to carry out their activities in a lawful manner at the festival. The video taken on Saturday illustrates that the group returned to the festival after the four arrests on Friday.

Acts 17 Apologetics has been at the Arab Festival in past years and is well aware of the written policy with regard to crowd control. They are also aware of a federal court decision in favor of the Dearborn policy of controlled access to the festival site.

This is standard practice at events all over the country. A site is identified and authorized by the government entity as a special event site. In the case of the Arab

Festival, it is a number of commercial blocks between the rear alley accesses behind the businesses on either side of the commercial road.

Despite knowing this, Acts 17 Apologetics lead the viewers of the distorted video to believe that they are on public sidewalks. For the duration of the three-day event, the public sidewalks in front of the stores and businesses in the event district are no longer "public" in terms of the application of the First Amendment. They are in an area controlled to protect public safety during the event because of the extreme number of people occupying a space that was never intended to support that much activity. This practice has been upheld by the Supreme Court in "Hefron vs. International Society for Krishna Consciousness"

The court decisions protect every community that must balance personal freedom with the need to provide public safety during an unusual situation.

At the time he was arrested on Friday, June 18, Mr. Wood had gathered a large crowd around him, blocking a key access point between the tents. The crowd was forced to grow bigger solely because people could not pass. Those who created this public danger did so with the knowledge that they were violating the laws because they wanted to be arrested while their cohorts were actively recording the event for posting on the web. They knew that they could inflame the passions of viewers who would be taken in by their misrepresentation of what was really going on. They have even found media that would put them on air to repeat these inaccurate representations without seeking information or the truth from others.

It makes a good news story to say that a community is infringing on peoples' rights especially when it is couched in the true bias of generating negative feelings about

another religion. The real violation of First Amendment rights occurs with Acts 17 Apologetics trying to imply they were the victim when the real violation is their attack on the City of Dearborn for having tolerance for all religions including believers in the Koran.

Dearborn is a true American City that welcomes everyone in the full spirit of our great constitution. We are a community of faith that is dedicated to the welfare of everyone whether resident or guest. These gross misrepresentations have caused us to come together in a stronger way.

Almost a year ago, after earlier attacks by Acts 17 Apologetics on Dearborn, I hosted a meeting with the Dearborn Area Ministerial Association (DAMA), a group of mostly Christian religious leaders, but inclusive of all faiths in Dearborn. I asked them to review the video from the 2009 festival, examine the facts and measure the impact on our community. The discussion was frank and sincere.

After that meeting with DAMA, a separate group of Dearborn Christian evangelical ministers released a written criticism of the actions and misrepresentations of Acts 17 Apologetics.

While inside the Command Trailer during ArabFest, Sgt Mrowka, Ofc Smith and I were notified by Roger Williams (Festival Volunteer) that he had just been harassed by a film crew and Amal Alslami had witnessed the incident. Williams stated a film crew began recording him doing his Festival duties. He advised the subjects (later identified as Negeen Mayel, Nabeel Qureshi, David Wood, and Paul Rezkalla) that he did not want to be filmed and told them to stop. Williams stated that they did not stop and instead, began to surround him. He added that he felt extremely uncomfortable and thought he could not leave although he attempted to several times. They continued to pester him and badger him with questions and continued filming. Williams again told them to stop filming. Qureshi and Wood, as well as Rezkalla, finally put down the microphone and camcorder to speak

with him but he noticed Mayel still filming within hearing distance. He radioed to security for assistance and the parties soon left. He advised Alslami that he wished to make a formal complaint with police.

Alslami stated she observed the above incident as Williams had recalled. She stated she took photographs of the subjects with her camera for identification purposes, although she did not have same in her possession at the time of report.

Sgt Mrowka instructed Ofc Smith and me to accompany Williams and Alslami in order to identify the subjects involved. As we approached the two large tents on Warren west of Miller, Williams and Alslami pointed out a female (Mayel) filming a large crowd in the in the far west tent. Qureshi, Wood, and Rezkalla were inside the crowd and were also identified by Williams. I approached Mayel and advised her that I was conducting a criminal investigation I needed her to stop filming in order to answer questions. She refused to comply by walking away from me, continuing to film, and loudly asking "what criminal investigation". I followed her and ordered her to shut the camcorder off so I could ask her questions pertaining to my investigation. She again refused by continuing to film and looking to the large crowd where the other subjects were. She again began speaking very loudly in attempts to get the attention of the other subjects in the large crowd and tried to move closer to them. I placed my hand on her elbow and again ordered her to comply with my instructions and cooperate with my investigation. She began to scream toward the crowd "Don't touch me...get your hands off me" as she continued to film. Fearing she may incite a riot, I removed the camcorder from her hand and escorted Mayel from the inside of the tent and away from the crowd. Ofc Smith took custody of the camcorder.

Mayel finally became cooperative and stated that she was told by Qureshi, Wood, and Rezkalla to "continue filming no matter what". She further stated that she had nothing to do with the incident with Williams and her job was just to film same. She repeatedly apologized for her actions and stated she was only doing what she was told to do.

I relayed the information to Sgt Mrowka and he advised us to arrest all parties involved for Breach of Peace. Ofc Micallef, Ofc Ballard, Ofc Smith and I located Qureshi, Wood, and Rezkalla in the center of another large crowd in the middle of the two tents. When we advised them to turn their camcorders off and that they were under arrest for Breach of Peace, they were hesitant but eventually complied. Wood even went as far as lifting the camcorder into the air in order to continue filming. Qureshi began screaming "See, I told you...I told you this stuff happens" to the large crowd who began taking pictures of us and surrounding us further. Fearing again that a riot would ensue, I requested Qureshi to remain quiet and ordered the crowd to vacate the area or they would be arrested. The large crowd complied and Qureshi, Wood, and Rezkalla were placed under arrest (Handcuffed & Double-Locked) for Breach of Peace without further incident. Mayel was placed under arrest (Handcuffed & Double-Locked) for Breach of Peace and Fail to Obey PO Direction/Order. They were then escorted to the Command Trailer and searched.

The video equipment each subject had in his/her possession was seized as evidence by Ofc Smith and I (See above). It should be noted that none of the subjects turned off the camcorders as ordered. Police had to do same at the Command Trailer.

Ofc Ballard transported Mayel to the station while Ofc Smith and I transported Qureshi, Wood, and Rezkalla. Proper booking procedures were completed. Sgt Conrad was advised of the incident. Mayel's property (NO CASH) was secured in Locker #34 and she was assigned cell #34. She was issued ULC #296614 for Breach of Peace and Fail to Obey with a \$1000 BOND attached. Wood's property (\$54 CASH) was secured in Locker #8 and he was assigned Cell #8. He was issued ULC #296616 for Breach of Peace with a \$500 BOND attached. Qureshi's property (\$85 CASH) was secured in Locker #13 and he was assigned Cell #13. He was issued ULC #296613 for Breach of Peace with a \$500 BOND attached. Rezkalla's property (NO CASH) was secured in Locker #2 and he was assigned Cell #2. He was issued ULC #296615 for Breach of Peace with a

\$500 BOND attached. All subjects were advised to contact the 19th District Court within 14 days for a hearing date.

En Route to the station, Qureshi, Wood, and Rezkalla asked me about the allegations. I explained they were under arrest for Breach of Peace and explained the allegations against them. Without questioning, they stated that they never "surrounded" Williams. Qureshi and Wood added they did film him speaking with another individual who supposedly was distributing pamphlets against City Ordinance. When they began confronting Williams about the conversation, Qureshi and Wood stated he did ask them to stop filming but they continued and repeated their questions. After being asked by Williams again, Qureshi lowered the microphone and instructed Wood to stop filming. Wood stated he stopped filming Williams but did not shut the camcorder off in order to catch the conversation on film. After brief conversation with Williams, they stated Williams radioed for security and they continued to ask him questions including why he needed to call for security. They later left and saw a female taking pictures of them so they filmed her doing same. Qureshi, Wood, and Rezkalla stated the reason they were filming at ArabFest in the first place was in response to an incident last year involving security assaulting them. They wanted everyone at the festival to know of "the injustice and brutality".

The listed evidence was tagged and logged in the Property Book (pg 34943) and secured inside the Evidence Cage.

At 0116 hrs, Mayel posted \$1000 BOND and was released from custody. She was issued Bond Receipt #D25766 and instructed to contact the 19th District Court in 3-14 days.

At 0240 hrs, Qureshi and Wood posted \$500 BOND and were released from custody. They were issued Bond Receipt #D25767 and #D25768 respectively and instructed to contact the 19th District Court in 3-14 days.

At 0315 hrs, Rezkalla posted \$500 BOND and was released from custody. He was issued Bond Receipt #D25769 and instructed to contact the 19th District Court in 3-14 days.



This incident involves the arrest of four individuals for Breach of Peace at the Dearborn Arab Festival on 6/18/10. The four individuals were identified as Nabeel Qureshi, David Wood, Paul Rezkalla, and Negeen Mayel. One of the individuals, Negeen Mayel, was also charged with Fail To Obey a Police Officer. They are affiliated with a Christian group founded by Nabeel Qureshi and David Wood called Acts17 Apologetics. It's my understanding from looking at the Acts17 website, along with the website, answeringmuslims.com, that this group believes that 'Sharia law' is in effect in the city of Dearborn and that this belief has permeated the police department and city officials. Their intention for showing up at the Dearborn Arab Festival, according to their own website, is to observe the event and have conversations with different people at the festival regarding the topic of Christianity.

On the evening of 6/18/10, Sgt. Mrowka, who was the on-site OIC at the Arab Fest, was informed by event volunteers that there was another group there that was causing problems and harassing people. One volunteer in particular, Roger Williams, approached the command trailer at the Arab Fest to tell police about a group of four specific individuals who have been harassing him and making him feel unsafe. Sgt. Mrowka had Williams and another volunteer, Amal Aslami, identify the four subjects who were subsequently arrested for Breach of Peace. At the time of their arrest, all four individuals had some type of video or audio equipment in their possession. All of these items were confiscated by police.

I spoke to Sgt. Mrowka about the arrest and he explained that the situation at the Arab Fest involving these four individuals was getting to the point where he was concerned about the safety of the people in attendance and the good order of the event. Due to these four individuals' behavior at the event, and in order to prevent a possible riot or some other type of violence from erupting from the people in attendance, he believed that all four should be taken into custody.

I contacted Roger Williams by phone to ask him about the incident Friday night. Williams stated

that he was at the festival as an event volunteer and has been volunteering at this particular event for the past 10 years. Williams went on to reiterate what was in the original report stating that he felt he was being harassed by a group of individuals while doing his job. Williams stated he went to the police command trailer and informed them what just happened.

I asked Williams, who stated he was leaving to go back to Florida the next morning, to complete a written statement regarding the incident and email it to me when he gets back home. Williams agreed and stated he would email it to me this week.

After the four arrested subjects posted their bonds and were released, they all four appeared on the website answeringmuslims.com, as well as YouTube, and discussed the circumstances surrounding the arrest. They also mentioned that they had video footage on the cameras that police confiscated that would show exactly what happened.

Also, one of the arrestees, Nabeel Qureshi, wrote this on the answeringmuslims.com website: "David and I, along with Negeen and Paul Rezkalla, were arrested and spent last night in jail. It is a long story which we will elaborate in full detail when we can, and will post footage when the police give us back our cameras."

In addition, Nabeel Qureshi wrote, "Paul, David, Negeen, and I went to the festival to see and comment on the situation. Thankfully, we recorded every second of our activity at the festival."

As a result of these comments, coupled with other related factors, I completed a search warrant to have the video footage on the confiscated video cameras viewed and copied. After the warrant was completed, Judge Somers of the 19th District Court reviewed and signed it.

6/23/10 - 11:00am

I talked to Amal Alslami who was one of the event volunteers who assisted Roger Williams on the night of the incident. I asked Amal to tell me what happened and she stated she was on her golf cart patrolling the grounds when Roger Williams came up to and told her about the individuals who just harassed him. Amal stated she went with Williams to the police command trailer and assisted in identifying the people that Williams stated was involved. Amal stated she didn't see any of the confrontation between Williams and the four subjects arrested.

6/24/10 - 0000

I attempted to have all the police radio communications related to the time surrounding the arrest copied by Lt. Kanitra. However I was informed that all communications at the Arab Fest were done an a special 'event channel' and were not recorded. Also, all the communications done by the private security personnel and event volunteers at the event were done on rented communication equipment and was not recorded.

Dear Vendor:

Thank you for your interest in the 15th Annual Dearborn International Festival. Please read these Rules & Regulations carefully before you complete and submit the application.

Process:

Complete, sign and submit the application with deposit. The Chamber reviews all applications and reserves the right to accept or decline such. Deposits of rejected applicants are promptly refunded. Read the rules and regulations completely. You may be contacted by the Chamber for more detailed or specific information about your application. A final decision is not made at the time of the application submission.

Deadline:

A signed copy of this application must be completed and received in our office accompanied by a check no later than <u>June 4, 2010</u>. Please make checks payable to <u>American Arab Chamber of Commerce</u>. Please see attached application for a breakdown of fees.

Electrical Requirements:

Booths requiring electricity will be charged a \$75.00 fee. Standard electrical booths will be equipped with one (1) 20-amp circuit and one (1) 110-volt duplex plug. If you require additional electricity, you will be notified of any additional expense. IMPORTANT: The deadline for electrical requirements is with this application on May 15, 2010. Vendors are not allowed to run their own electricity at the festival, and we will only accommodate vendors who have made their requests before the deadline of May 15, 2010.

Food Vendor Signage:

It is the responsibility of the vendor to obtain a sign for their booth. However, if you wish to have our contractor do the sign for you, please fill out the attached form. The cost for the sign is \$75.00. The price includes the name of your company/organization and items for sale. It is required that you have a sign. However, it is not required that you use our contractor to produce the sign. If you choose to make your own sign, it must be in accordance with the Dearborn Arab International Festival sign requirements. <u>SIGNAGE MUST BE PRE-APPROVED BY THE FESTIVAL DIRECTOR</u>. The requirements are as follows:

A coroplast sign with vinyl letters, 32" x 48", white lettering on a black background. Two grommets must be located at the top of the sign to hang above your concession window. The sign will look like this:

FOOD BOOTH RULES & REGULATIONS - continued

Concession Sales:

In order to ensure the safe and controlled sale of concession goods, the following rules shall be enforced:

- 1. No sale of beverages, soda or water permitted without prior authorization by Festival Director.
- 2. No sales or solicitation shall be permitted outside designated vendor areas, including the use of amplifiers.
- 3. No open flames shall be permitted without prior approval of the Festival Director.
- 4. All propane tanks must be properly secured so as to avoid falling over.
- 5. All combustibles must be at least 36 inches away from flames, grills and/or ovens.
- 6. Each vendor must provide the type of extinguisher appropriate to the hazard.
- 7. Any charcoal, gas or other cooking device with unapproved open flame shall not be permitted inside the tent.
- 8. All used charcoal must be put in a water-filled metal container, supplied by the vendor and disposed at a city-designated site.
- No grease or oil shall be poured down drains or sewers and they shall not be poured on the grass or street. A container will be provided where you can dump the grease.
- 10. Food vendors must adhere to all applicable city, county and state health regulations.
- 11. No tents, booths, canopies, tent extensions or temporary shelters may be erected without prior approval of the Festival Director.
- 12. No political or unrelated advertising signs shall be posted in booths or outside vendor tents.
- 13. Sales shall be conducted only from the front of the booths or outside the vendor tents. "Front" means along the middle aisle of the tent, not the edge along the outside of the tent. Absolutely no sales shall be permitted from the rear of the vendor tent booths.
- 14. All vendor activities shall be confined to designated rental areas. In the vendor tents, no activities, including storage, cooking food preparation, etc. shall take place outside the tent perimeter.
- 15. Mechanical refrigeration must be provided. NO ICE CHESTS ARE ALLOWED.
- 16. Hot food must be maintained at a minimum of 140°F or greater.
- 17. All bread must be kept in plastic bags or covered containers.
- 18. A sufficient number of clean, back-up utensils shall be available when the original utensils become contaminated.
- 19. Stab-type food product thermometer with a minimum range of 0°F 220°F must be provided.
- 20. All food, while being prepared, stored, displayed or transported to a temporary food service establishment must be protected against contamination from dust, vermin and other sources. Containers of food shall be stored a minimum of six inches above the floor in a manner that protects the food from splash and other contamination, and that permits easy cleaning of the storage areas.
- 21. Potentially hazardous food shall be kept at an internal temperature of 45°F or below and at an internal temperature of 140°F or above during display and service.
- 22. All condiments and sauces must be covered at all times, except when being used.
- 23. Shawarma must be kept at temperature of 140°F or higher and must be served in four (4) hours or less.
- 24. Hand wipes (Individual Moist Towels) must be provided.
- 25. In consideration of neighboring booths, builhorns, loud music and other amplification devices to "hawk" sales are prohibited.

FOOD BOOTH RULES & REGULATIONS - continued

In the interest of maintaining an orderly, peaceful and enjoyable Festival, the following rules shall be strictly enforced. Any infractions of these rules may result in eviction from the Festival or other appropriate action.

Parking & Traffic Flow:

In order to ensure a safe and uninterrupted flow of pedestrian and vehicular traffic during the Festival, the following rules shall be enforced with **NO EXCEPTIONS**:

- 1. Parking shall be permitted in designated areas only. Any infraction will result in vehicles being ticketed and towed at the owner's expense.
- 2. No overnight parking shall be permitted.
- 3. No vehicular traffic shall be permitted on the festival site during posted hours of operation for the Festival, with the exception of city and emergency vehicles.
- 4. All vendor vehicle deliveries and pick-ups must be completed before and after the Festival hours of operation. Vendor vehicles will not be allowed in the Festival site during hours of Festival operation. Unattended vehicles will be ticketed and towed at the owner's expense.
- 5. The location of the reserved parking area for city and vendor vehicles is forthcoming. Vendor vehicles displaying passes in the front windshield may park in this reserved area. Passes must be displayed in the parked vehicles at all times. Vendor vehicles that do not have complete and required information (name and phone number) on passes will be towed at the owner's expense.
- 6. Vendor supply vehicles may park in designated areas only. Drivers must secure permission from the Festival Director for overnight parking.

Solicitation / Miscellaneous Rules:

- 1. No advertisements, flyers, coupons, literature, paraphernalia or other such matter shall be placed on parked vehicles.
- 2. No unauthorized performances, sales, demonstrations, exhibits, or solicitations of any kind shall be permitted.
- 3. No political solicitation of any kind shall be permitted on the Festival grounds
- 4. No animals shall be permitted on the Festival grounds with the exception of Seeing Eye dogs.
- 5. City ordinances concerning littering will be strictly enforced.
- 6. No person shall operate or cause to be operated any source or loud or unusual noise that disturbs the peace or causes any discomfort or annoyance to any reasonable person.
- 7. No persons shall engage in any conduct threatening, endangering or impairing the safety, health or comfort of others, or shall indulge in profane or indecent language, or any improper or indecent conduct or any unduly boisterous or offensive conduct of any character.
- 8. No persons shall take part in the playing of games involving thrown or otherwise propelled objects such as balls, stones, arrows, javelins, horseshoes, kites or model airplanes. With the exception of officially scheduled events, the playing of organized games such as football, softball and the like is prohibited.
- 9. No loltering shall be permitted on the Festival grounds or in any areas where such activity would impede pedestrian flow.
- 10. No rollerblades, skateboards, or bicycles shall be permitted on the Festival grounds.

All attendees must strictly adhere to hours of operation Regular hours for vendor operations are:

Friday, June 18, 2010 5:00 p.m. – 10:00 p.m. Saturday, June 19, 2010 11:00 a.m. – 10:00 p.m. Sunday, June 20, 2010 11:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m.







MEDICAL EMERGENCY

During a Medical Emergency the Fire Department will take the lead in Unified Command and dispatch the Fire Department golf cart rescue and its medical team directly to the scene. The Police and all volunteer organizations will assist as requested by the Incident Commander. The Medics will then Triage and begin treatment of the pt/s and call for transport and additional help as needed.

The transporting rescue will stage at the location designated either by the medic on scene or by the police officer in charge of traffic control.

POLICE EMERGENCY

During a Police Emergency the Police Department will take the lead in Unified Command. The Fire Department and all volunteer organizations will assist as requested by Incident Command.

FIRE EMERGENCY

During a Fire Emergency the Fire department will take the lead in Unified Command. The Police and all volunteer organizations will assist as requested by Incident Command. Crowd safety and control will be top priorities for all operations. Dispatched fire crews will be directed on access and staging by police and fire crews on scene already.

SEVERE WEATHER, TORNADO, THUNDERSTORM, & FLOOD

During the entire Arab-American Festival event Dearborn Office of Emergency Management, Police, Fire, and Dispatch will closely monitor the weather with a daily call in to the White Lake office of NOAA for updates on the weather. If the weather looks threatening they will call in hourly for the latest updates. If weather looks threatening they will advise the Arab-American Festival command as to postpone or cancel the days activates.

NOTIFICATION

Notification of the public, for Emergency messages, will utilize the following methods: The Outdoor Warning System, Arab-American PA system, Police and Fire PA systems, Police, Fire, and Volunteer organizations handing out information or word of mouth notification.

All messages to be delivered shall come from ONE source, the Public Information Office, in collaboration with the Police, Fire, and Office of Emergency Management.

EFFECTIVE DATE: 3-29-95

AMENDED: 03-08-00

ACTIVATION:

Dispatch Center staff shall **immediately** activate the early warning siren system whenever one of the following conditions occurs:

- 1) A tornado warning is issued for anywhere in Wayne County by the National Weather Service,
- 2) A tornado sighting has been confirmed by a legitimate source,
- 3) When severe thunderstorm warnings include call-to-action information that the storm (s) will produce winds of 70mph or greater,

Simultaneously, the Dispatch Center staff shall notify City Officials via the Airtouch paging system identified as the "Major Incident" group. The Dispatch Center staff shall then notify the Police Department Officer in Charge and make announcements over both the police and fire radios. If for some reason there is legitimate doubt as to whether the system should be activated, advise the dispatch shift Supervisor on duty. If unable to contact the dispatch shift Supervisor, and if time permits to contact the Communications Manager. If unable to make any of the aforementioned contacts, or if while attempting any of the contacts time does not ~permit. A CTIVATE THE SYSTEM and then follow above notification procedures. Also, anytime the system is activated, for whatever reason, (except for the Saturday test), follow the above notification procedures.

USE OF Arab-American Festival PA SYSTEM

Is controlled by the Arab-American Festival office of information, but may be commandeered by the Police or Fire for Emergency use only.

SHELTER IN PLACE

Shelter in Place operations will be called for by the Arab-American Festival Incident Command with its Intel coming from Police, Fire, and Emergency Management. Shelter in place may be used for slight rain storms utilizing the tents, and comfort station. The tents are NOT to be used for shelter in Place operations during Thunder Storms, High Winds or Tornados.

EVACUATION

The Arab-American Festival may need to be evacuated for several reasons, some of which may involve routs being blocked or cut off. Emergency evacuation routes will be kept fluid and not published until the need for them arises. If an evacuation, (emergency or non emergency) see NOTIFICATION.

EMERGENCY SHELTERS

Sheltering on site is limited to the comfort station at Ford Field and will serve as a small limited access shelter for severe weather storms. Emergency Evacuation Shelters are as follows; any Dearborn Public School and nearby residents.

TRANSPORTATION

Visitors that arrived at the festival will be advised to use their own transportation.

The 15th Annual Dearborn Arab International Festival will consist of a carnival, numerous food vendor tents, artisan's tents, a children's tent, and an entertainment stage featuring multicultural performances. The dally hours of operation have been slightly expanded for the 2010 festival and are as follows:

Friday, June 18, 2010

4:00 P.M. - 11:00 P.M.

Saturday, June 19, 2010

11:00 A.M. -- 11:00 P.M.

Sunday, June 20, 2010

11:00 A.M. - 9:00 P.M.

In order to facilitate and continue to ensure that adequate traffic safety/control measures are in place, the 2010 Dearborn Arab International Festival outer perimeter boundaries will be set as follows: Warren Avenue and Schaefer Highway; Morrow Circle South/Gould and Biesser Streets.

The festival boundaries for the 2010 festival will be as follows: Warren Avenue (business alley to business alley) between Hartwell and Kingsley Streets; Miller Road (business alley to business alley) between Warren Avenue and Blesser Street. The American Arab Chamber of Commerce respectfully request that these roadways be closed as follows:

- Miller Road between Warren Avenue and Blesser Street on Thursday, June 17, 2010 at 4:00 P.M., and re-opened on Monday, June 21, 2010 at 6:00 A.M.
- Warren Avenue between Hartwell and Kingsley Streets on Thursday, June 17, 2010 at 6:00 P.M., and re-opened on Monday, June 21, 2010 at 6:00 A.M.

 Warren Avenue between Hartwell and Reuter Streets on Friday, June 18, 2010 from 5:00 P.M. until 8:00 P.M. in order to accommodate the VIP Reception and Ribbon Cutting Ceremony.

The festival committee also requests that the City Council authorize the American Arab Chamber of Commerce to issue all sidewalk sales permits for the event within the designated festival boundaries.

In a continued effort to reduce the traffic impact to the immediate surrounding neighborhoods, the festival committee is requesting permission to use the City owned vacant lots off Lonyo Street for additional off-site festival parking. In addition to these sites, the festival committee is also in the process of securing additional off-site parking space at a number of other sites in east Dearborn. Once again, the festival committee will provide and highly promote the use of a shuttle bus service to these various off-site parking locations, which will be identified in future advertising materials.

As always, assistance from the Dearborn Police, Fire, Public Works, Economic & Community Development and Recreation Departments will be required to insure a safe, healthy, fun and successful event. Representatives from these departments have been involved in all of the preliminary planning meetings in order to address the city/public concerns from previous festival years (traffic safety, parking, temporary food license compliance, issuing of sidewalk sales permits, carnival license, noise and litter). The Police, Fire, Public Works, Economic & Community Development and Recreation Department Administrations acknowledge that they are familiar with all of the details in conjunction with this year's event, and have no immediate concerns with the American Arab Chamber of Commerce conducting the 15Th Annual Dearborn Arab International Festival on June 18-20, 2010.
